IRSYAD DAWOOD

Irsyad plays an older Zubir Said in *Impact 2023*. Irsyad is a performer/theatre-maker. His practice centres around various forms of performance including, but not limited to, acting, puppetry, and performance art.

Irsyad co-founded NAYA, an art collective that specialises in curating art workshops and experiences for children & young people, with three other SOTA Visual Arts alumni.

His recent performance credits include *T0701* (Zeugma), *Bangsawan Gemala Malam* (Teater Ekamatra) and *Pan-dance-mic* (Singapore Art Museum). He is currently playing the Cat in *Cat in the Hat* staged by the Singapore Repertory Theatre's The Little Company.

Irsyad dedicates each performance to his mother and late father who have been supportive of his passion for theatre since young.



JOAN DWIARTANTO

Joan Dwiartanto is a dance alumna from the class of 2017. This is her second time participating in *Impact* and created the multimedia featured in *Impact 2023*. A multifaceted artist who enjoys growing both as a dancer and as a choreographer and filmmaker. She graduated from The Juilliard School Dance class of 2022, where she was able to nurture her love for dance and her newfound love for choreography and dance filmmaking.

In 2020, Joan co-directed a collaborative film for The Park Avenue Armory's 100 Years | 100 Women event in New York City, and in 2021 worked with the principal dancer of the American Ballet Theatre, James Whiteside as the creative videographer and editor in creating his own Ballet film, Marilyn's Funeral. She then went on to direct and produce her own dance film, Crying On The Island They Own which premiered in early 2022 and has since won multiple festival awards.

NABIL JASMANI

As one of the pioneer Theatre students of SOTA from the class of 2012, Nabil ventured onto a diverse pathway as a firefighter upon graduation. A thespian and arts patron at heart, Nabil continues to pursue his passion for the arts when presented with the opportunity.

Playing multiple characters in *Impact 2023* such as a younger Zubir Said, Zubir Said's father and student, Nabil has been a positive and radiant presence for the show, sharing his knowledge and experience to mentor his juniors. Nabil's natural ability to bring people together carries on into his full-time job as a community involvement officer at Singapore Civil Defence Force.

Nabil is ever-ready to give back to the school and has returned on numerous occasions such as performing in the production, *Body of Land* as part of SG50 in 2015, or giving career talks to his juniors.



SAB

Sab (they/them) is a freelance writer (when they can find the time for it). A recipient of both the National Arts Council Arts Scholarship and the Singapore Unbound Fellowship, their work has been performed in Singapore, London and Perth.

Sab is also a member of Main Tulis Group, Singapore's first playwright collective focusing on English and Malay texts. As part of their practice, Sab is committed to championing the voices of the minority. They are also interested in finding new ways to tell old stories.

SITI SYAKIRAH NOBLE

An acclaimed singer-songwriter based in both Singapore and Kuala Lumpur, Syakirah has performed in a wide variety of events ranging from high profile performances to live shows on national television. Notably, she emerged as the first runner-up in Mediacorp Suria channel's reality singing competition, "Anugerah Mengejar Impian" in 2017. She is currently also teaching at The Voice Company and the Singapore Raffles Music College.

Syakirah will be performing songs composed by Zubir Said, allowing the audience to experience the depth and emotion behind his timeless creations. Her heartfelt renditions promise to be a poignant tribute to Zubir Said's enduring legacy.

In the future, she aspires to set up a music school to make lessons accessible to children with financial difficulties, as she believes that music is a gift that should truly be accessible to all.



RAIYA BASALAMAH

Raiya is an artist and drama educator who graduated from SOTA in 2017. She plays Zubir Said's wife, Tarminah in *Impact 2023*. In 2022, Raiya wrote an audio play titled *Beautiful*, in response to Theatre of Others' theme, *Fifty Years From Now* for their Audio New Play Festival that year. The play focused on the impact of beauty standards, cosmetic surgery, and how that might escalate in our technologically advanced society.

As of now, she has taught drama to young people for almost three years, and they include secondary school students who earned a Certificate of Distinction for their 2023 SYF Arts Presentation.

The Impact logo was designed by Visual Arts students Clariss Tan and Emma Grace Sung. The students used two triangles replacing the 'a' to represent a fast-forward icon that illustrates how the SOTA Endowment Fund is forward-looking. The students also wanted to capture the idea of a blank canvas similar to the SOTA logo, to demonstrate that despite the different environments the logo may be placed in, it is able to adapt.
