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SOTA RELEASES 2017 IB EXAMINATION RESULTS

- The 2017 cohort from the School of the Arts, Singapore (SOTA) will collect their International Baccalaureate Career-related Programme (IBCP) and IB Diploma Programme (IBDP) results from the school at 12pm today.
- SOTA's IBCP students did exceptionally well this year, with over 90% of the cohort achieving excellence in their examinations comprising Career-related Studies and DP subjects. This marks the best performance by IBCP students since SOTA pioneered the programme in 2014.
- In line with its vision, SOTA aims to identify and groom future generations of artists and creative professionals to be leaders in all fields. "The holistic education in SOTA has really taught me to think more critically, examine social issues and assess situations from different areas of knowledge and perspectives. SOTA's level of openness to experimentation has also given me a safe space for making mistakes as well as opportunities to initiate independent projects," Lim Zeharn, IBCP Visual Arts student.
- Zeharn's work had been showcased in various local and international festivals, museums and exhibitions, most recently in UNTAPPED Discovery by the Visual Arts Development Association (VADA). He plans to further his studies in Fine Arts after National Service.
- 5 The IBCP programme is offered to SOTA's Year 5 and 6 students who demonstrate exceptional artistic ability and potential in pursuing a career in the arts. The programme allows the students to spend more time honing their artistic skills and preparing their portfolios for admission into arts institutes and conservatories.
- Many outstanding IBCP graduates have gone on to pursue the arts at internationally acclaimed institutions. Graduates from earlier cohorts such as Nur Sabrina Bte Dzulkifli, Samuel Phua, and Nur Aqilah Binte Hassan are also recipients of the National Arts Council scholarship. Nur Sabrina and Nur Aqilah are currently pursuing their undergraduate degrees at the University of Essex in England and Glasgow School of Art in Scotland respectively, while Samuel Phua will be studying Music at the Sibelius Academy in Helsinki, Finland.
- A total of 131 students also sat for the IBDP examinations in 2017 and achieved a 100% pass rate. Over 80% of them scored 35 points and above.
