(A) Checklist

(A.1) for Submission of Supporting Documents to be uploaded via the TA Portal

- It takes about 45 minutes to 1 hour to complete the entire application for **ONE** (1) artform, provided that the portfolio submission and all supporting documents have been prepared in advance.
- Submit your applications early, as the TA Portal may experience slower connectivity due to high traffic towards the close of the application period.
- There will be no extension of deadline for submission of application. Incomplete applications will be disqualified. Appeals for late submissions will <u>not</u> be considered.

(B) Preparation Notes for Portfolio Submission in Music IBCP (for all applicants)

Students specialising in Music will experience the spectrum of music, from voice and instrumental study to music theory and analysis, and composition. They will discover music from around the world and examine the development of music across traditions and history. They will also develop craft, perspective, and dispositions of a musician, which will enrich their journey in any field beyond SOTA.

SOTA offers the IB Career-related Programme (IBCP) in Year 5 and 6. IBCP students will engage in a programme of study and will equip them with transferable and lifelong skills in applied knowledge, critical thinking, communication, and cross-cultural engagement as they prepare for professional pathways and vocations in the arts. SOTA's IBCP qualification is recognized by arts colleges and conservatories worldwide. For a list of recognized institutions, visit https://www.sota.edu.sg/why-sota/ib.

Students in the Music IBCP can choose to specialize in either Performance or Composition and must take Music at the Higher Level (HL). The nature of exposure and opportunities will be dependent upon the area of specialization.

To apply, you need to have a strong passion for your chosen field and the intention to continue your studies at a music college or conservatory. If you're applying for the Performance track, you must be exceptionally strong technically and musically in your instrument(s). For the Composition track, you must have a wide range of musical experiences and show this in your portfolio and interview.

You are expected to have a good knowledge of Western analysis and music theory and need to be able to read bass, alto and treble clef. You also need to have some awareness of music of non-western cultures.

You will be expected to be imaginative, enthusiastic, expressive, co-operative, open-minded and flexible thinkers, and self-driven learners. A strong command of English, spoken and written, is a key prerequisite. A keen interest in all aspects of the arts is clearly essential.

(B.1) What to Submit for the Composition Track Portfolio

3 Items to Submit	Composition Track
(1) Portfolio of 2 compositions	 Each composition should consist of the following: Minimum three (3) minutes long and maximum of six (6) minutes. To include music scores and recordings. Live recording is preferred but a midi version is acceptable. Recorded in a single take.
(2) Recordings of performance on your principal instrument	 Video recordings of a contrasting programme (between 8-10 min) that demonstrate your best performance qualities on your principal instrument. You must present your programme with an accompanist if the pieces require one. Accompanists are not required for piano, traditional Chinese instrumentalists and traditional Indian instrumentalists. A minus-one CD or backing track will not be permitted (except for drummers, electric guitarists and bassists). Submission of music scores of the works you have recorded. Record separate videos for each work. Recorded in a single take. No editing.
(3) Music Scores	 Submit music scores for items 1 and 2. Combine all music scores into 1 pdf document.
How to Submit	 Save all recordings and music scores into a folder. Name the folder with your full name. Upload the folder to Google Drive. Privacy Setting: ensure that it is set to 'Anyone with the Link'. Paste the shared link on the TA Portal in the 'Uploaded to External Site URL' field.
Notes	 Supporting documents, portfolios, and photographs submitted for shortlisting will be retained for the school's records. Certificates, achievement records, testimonials, recommendation letters are <u>not</u> required. 'Principal instrument' refers to the instrument on which you are most comfortable to perform and audition for SOTA. You will not be permitted to switch your principal instrument upon acceptance into SOTA.

(C.1) Entrance Tests – Information for Non-DSA applicants

You may refer to the local GCE 'O' level assessment books for the following subjects to familiarise yourself with the topics and exercises.

The entrance tests will be scheduled on 20 June. Only shortlisted Non-DSA applicants are required to take the tests.

More information will be shared with shortlisted candidates on how the tests will be conducted.

English Comprehension and Writing	 You will be given 5 minutes to read the instructions carefully, and 1 hour 15 minutes to complete the test. Based on an expository text, candidates will answer a variety of questions testing close reading and comprehension skills, vocabulary in context and the use of language for impact Based on an expository text, students will respond to an author's key arguments. 			
Mathematics	 You will be given 5 minutes to read the instructions carefully, and 1 hour 30 minutes to complete the test. No calculator or Graphic Display Calculator is allowed. Formula Booklet will be provided. Candidates must complete 10 problem-solving questions that carry a total of 80 marks. The topics that will be covered are as follows: Prior Knowledge of Year 1 to 4 Mathematics (Elementary Mathematics and some Additional Mathematics) is required. Functions and Graphs Quadratic Functions and Graphs Nature of roots for Quadratic Functions Logarithms Trigonometry: Identities, Double Angle Formula and Trigonometric Graphs Differentiation of Polynomials, Exponential and Logarithmic Functions Applications of Differentiation: Increasing and Decreasing Functions and Equations of Tangents and Normals Integration of Polynomials Applications of Integration: Area 			

(D) Audition Details

(D.1) What You Will Experience During the Talent Academy

You will be required to participate in and complete the following compulsory activities in SOTA:

- 1. Entrance Tests (for Non-DSA candidates only)
- 2. Panel Interview and Online Questionnaires (no preparations required)
- 3. Music Auditions:
 - a. Listening Paper
 - b. Performance of programme, which includes a mini-lesson and interview by a panel of music teachers
 - c. Composition session

(D.2) How to Prepare for Music Audition

Composition Track Only

1. Critical Listening Paper (60 Minutes)

- You will be asked to listen to musical excerpts and write an analysis of the works.
- No preparation is required.

2. Composition session

- You will discuss the works submitted to a panel of SOTA faculty members.
- You will be given 30 minutes to do a composition exercise.

3. Performance

- You will perform the 8-10 min programme that you have submitted via the TA portal.
- You <u>must</u> present your programme with an accompanist if the chosen pieces require one.
- A minus-one CD or backing track will not be permitted (except for drummers, electric guitarists and bassists).
- You must be able to speak about the pieces you have performed, how you have prepared for the audition and other interesting points that you would like to share with the panelists.

4. Mini Lesson

- You may be asked to present your pieces a second or a third time.
- You may be asked to perform the pieces again with a fresh emphasis, emotion or attitude in order to encourage you to display flexibility.

5. Interview

- You will be asked questions about all facets of music, and given an opportunity to share your portfolio, past learning experiences and interest in music.
- You may wish to prepare a portfolio, which includes the following:
 - Music essays, projects or composition portfolio
 - Hard copies of relevant credentials that you have submitted in the TA application via the TA Portal

For all applicants:

- Be prepared and ready for the audition.
- Practice the programme well.
- You must present your programme with an accompanist if the pieces require one.
- Accompanists are not required for piano, traditional Chinese instrumentalists and traditional Indian instrumentalists.
- You must make your own arrangements to bring your accompanist along on your audition date.
- Be prepared to discuss the works submitted.
- Avoid uncomfortably tight clothes and shoes with heels.

Performance Track Only

(1) Critical Listening Paper (60 Minutes)

- You will be asked to listen to musical excerpts and write an analysis of the works.
- No preparation is required.

(2) 30-minute audition

For all applicants:

- Perform the pieces that you have submitted via the TA Portal.
- You <u>must</u> present the programme with an accompanist if your music pieces require one.
- A minus-one CD or backing track will not be permitted (except for drummers, electric quitarists and bassists)
- You must be able to speak about the pieces that you have performed, how you have prepared for the audition and other interesting points that you would like to share with the panelists.

- You are required to memorize your programme.
- Be prepared and ready for the audition.
- Practice the programme well.
- You must make your own arrangements to bring your accompanist along on your audition date.
- Avoid wearing uncomfortably tight clothes and shoes with heels.

For Jazz Instrumental Studies applicants only:

 You will also be required to do an improvisation on a 12-bar Blues Form, with multiple choruses.

(3) Mini Lesson

- You may be asked to present your pieces a second or a third time.
- You may be asked to perform the pieces again with a fresh emphasis, emotion or attitude in order to encourage you to display flexibility.

(4) Interview

- You will be asked questions about all facets of music, and given an opportunity to share your portfolio, past learning experiences and interest in music.
- You may wish to prepare a portfolio, which includes the following:
 - Music essays, projects or composition portfolio.
 - Hard copies of relevant credentials that you have submitted in the TA application via the TA Portal.

(5) Composition session

- You will discuss the works submitted to a panel of SOTA faculty members.
- You will be given 30 minutes to do a composition exercise.

The audition panel includes a teacher from SOTA's Faculty of Music and an external specialist.

The panelists are looking for musicianship, talent, and an ability to learn.

The panel may not always listen to the entire musical performance.

(D.3) What to Bring

Your accompanist must report to the Security Counter at level 2 (ground floor) and show a copy of your TA Schedule to gain access to the passenger lift and to your allocated audition

Bring a sweater/jacket as you will be in air-conditioned venues. No shorts/short skirts, singlets, sandals or slippers are allowed.
Note	 Food The canteen will be operating from 21 June – 23 June. At least 1 halal stall and 1 drink stall will be operating (vegetarian stall not opened). You may bring packed food and drink. Movement & Safety A group of SOTA students will be accompanying you throughout your day in SOTA.

	 Release from SOTA All candidates who have completed all scheduled activities for the day will return to the assembly hall. When you're ready to leave, present your TA schedule to the SOTA staff. The SOTA staff attending to you will stamp and date your release time on your TA Schedule. Make your way to the level 5 gantry to exit the school. You will be asked to show your TA schedule by the security officer at the gantry for proof of stamp and release time.
