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(A) Checklist

(A.1) for Submission of Supporting Documents to be uploaded via the TA Portal

- It takes about 45 minutes to 1 hour to complete the entire application for **ONE** (1) artform, provided that the portfolio submission and all supporting documents have been prepared in advance.
- Submit your applications early, as the TA Portal may experience slower connectivity due to high traffic towards the close of the application period.
- There will be no extension of deadline for submission of application. Incomplete applications will be disqualified. Appeals for late submissions will not be considered.

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(B) Preparation Notes for Portfolio Submission in Visual Arts IBDP (for all applicants)

SOTA offers students specializing in Visual Arts the opportunity to develop deep knowledge and understanding in the techniques, theory, and history of visual arts. Students will develop analytical and critical abilities as they learn to investigate, annotate, and document their ideas and processes, in art making.

SOTA's IB Diploma qualification is recognised by top universities worldwide. Armed with their IB Diploma and extensive arts portfolio, SOTA graduates can look forward to the arts as a career or leverage their arts-enriched educational experience to embark on diverse career options such as journalism, law, architecture and more.

You may consider applying if you demonstrate talent or potential in areas on 2-dimensional (2D) work, such as drawing and painting or design; 3-dimensional (3D) work, such as sculpture and ceramics; or electronic- or lens-based work, such as media arts or photography.

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(C) Entrance Tests – Information for Non-DSA applicants

Candidates will only be required to take one of the Science tests.

The entrance tests will be scheduled on 20 June. Only shortlisted Non-DSA applicants are required to take the tests.

More information will be shared with shortlisted candidates on how the tests will be conducted.

The paper carries a total of 40 marks.The topics include kinetic particle theory, measurement and experimental techniques, elements, compounds and mixtures, the periodic table, atomic structure, chemical bonding and structure, stoichiometric relationships, acids, bases and salts, energetics, chemical kinetics, equilibrium, redox processes, the atmosphere and environment and organic chemistry.A calculator is required for Section B of this paper.The periodic table and names of elements will be provided.

The paper carries a total of 40 marks.• The topics include physical quantities and measurements, temperature and transfer of thermal energy, kinetic theory and thermal properties of matter, vectors and kinematics, dynamics, energy, work and power, other effects of forces, waves and electromagnetic spectrum, light, electric field and current of electricity, electric circuits, electric power, magnetism, electromagnetic induction and atomic structure and radioactivity.• A calculator is required for Section B of this paper.• A list of constants, multipliers, circuit symbols and formulas will be provided.

- d. 2 to 3 artworks that demonstrate a range of technical competencies and considerations.
- These artworks should reflect your artistic and skill-based abilities in 3 different mediums to create a composition.
 - The media can be 2-dimensional, 3-dimensional, time-based, lens-based or electronic-based art forms, such as painting, sculpture, graphic novel, or video, etc.

Instructions:

Each artwork should be clearly labelled with:

- Your full name
- Your TA Index Number (you would have received the TA index number upon successful submission of your TA application via the TA Portal. Eg. DSAJC/2024/VA123)
- Title of artwork
- Dimensions of artwork in centimetres (e.g. height, width and depth)
- Date of completion and/or duration of execution
- An indication on whether the artwork was done in your current school
- A short description of each artwork

2. Sketchbook (Compulsory)

- Sketchbook containing the 5 to 8 selected sketchbook pages of A4 – A3 size that were submitted in your Talent Academy application and created between 2021 – 2023.
- A sketchbook page may show a record of images and/or writings as part of a creative process. For example, it can be made up of quick sketches or drawings done in preparation for an artwork, and a short paragraph to explain the art/process for the completed Final Artworks Portfolio.

3. Annex B: Declaration of Authenticity of Portfolio for Shortlisted Candidates (Compulsory, Page 12)

- Complete and print hardcopy of Annex B, to be presented together with your portfolio

What to Expect and How to Prepare

You will be assessed for:

- Motivation and engagement
- Communication of ideas, processes, and personal opinions
- Art proposal
- Approaches to research

You should be prepared to share with the panelists about:

- The extent and diversity of your explorations and experimentation in the visual form.
- Your artistic responses towards the selected topic/theme and reflection on the different approaches taken.
- Involvement in projects or activities you may have undertaken as an art student in school or during your own time.
- Your intention for choosing the Visual Arts IBCP as expressed in your 500-word essay.

Do put thought into the selection of works for your portfolio as the TA Panel will not view artworks beyond the stated number during the Portfolio Interview session.

The TA Panel will only consider artworks presented during the Portfolio Interview session.
